Our **Parking, Dropoff, and Pick-up** situation has once again become very problematic as of late. Some important points to remember:

• The **safest place to drop off your children is at the front** of the school/community centre in the designated zone, by coming in parallel to the curb and pulling up as far as you can, dropping off quickly but safely, and exiting in a thoughtful and considerate manner.

• **DO NOT park your car on an angle or leave your car unattended** in this area. This is the biggest cause of congestion and frustration for other parents.

• **The parking lot is a one-way loop**. There have been several instances where people have driven into the *exit* off Gilley. This is completely unacceptable.

• Dropping off on Smith Drive is causing huge safety concerns and is annoying our neighbors. We have seen parents stop on Smith and their children are exiting the car from the driver's side directly onto the street and oncoming traffic. Seriously, WHAT ARE YOU THINKING?

- Arriving at school a few minutes earlier can prevent a lot of the traffic issues.
- BE PATIENT!

It is **in EVERYONE'S best interest** to be as safe as we can when driving near the school. You do not want your child to be harmed and you do not want to harm someone else's child. We can do better, and ALL be a part of the solution to keep everyone safe. THANK YOU!

## "Trick or Treat" Others with Respect

Halloween can be fun. However, we need to be aware that celebrating Halloween needs to be fun for ALL and not at the expense of equity seeking groups. **Halloween offers an opportunity to have meaningful conversations about costume choices with colleagues and students and requires consideration.** In doing so, it is important to keep in mind that we need to be sensitive to groups that have been marginalized through mimicry and cultural appropriation during Halloween and other 'dress up' events. A few things to keep in mind: It's good to keep in mind that the following are NOT Costumes: RACE (black face/brown face) CULTURE (Indigenous regalia/dreadlocks) RELIGIOUS FAITH (religious figures/gods/saints/gurus/hijab) GENDER (gender switching for humour or to mock) TRAUMA (hangman's noose/weapons)
