


# **BY THE NUMBERS...**

Almost 800 new books and resources were added to our LLC Collection over this past year. Many of these were student and staff requests. Also, many resources were purchased through a Diversity / Equity / Inclusion lens which helped our diverse community members feel seen and heard.

More than 40 intermediate students volunteered as library monitors over this past year. We also had many amazing Parent volunteers and their support was crucial to helping the Library stay as organized as possible through big changes.


