Braving the Elements for a Great Learning Experience!

On Wednesday this week Divisions 7 & 8 went to the Cheakamus Education Centre in Brackendale, just north of Squamish. The bus left at 7:00am and returned at 5:30pm. It was a long, and at times, wet day for the students, but by all accounts, they had a great time and enjoyed a wonderful learning experience. In the words of the teachers:

"Despite the long bus ride and cold temperatures, our day at Cheakamus center was full of knowledge and experiences that they will hopefully carry as a memory as the children continue to grow. When we arrived, we were treated with hot apple cider and a chocolate chip maple syrup oatmeal granola biscuit. We applaud all those who were courageous and respectful enough to try a new food, despite not knowing how it would taste. During our excursion, we had the opportunity to explore the biodiversity of the cedar forest of Cheakamus and spent time learning about the tools and ways of life of the Chi'yakmesh peoples of the Skwxwú7mesh (Squamish) Nation. An important piece of knowledge shared with us today is how nature is dependent on the lives that live within it and its ability to thrive depends on how well we take care of it. Students also learned about cooking shlom soup with grandfather stones and were particularly excited about preparing bannock over an open fire. In the afternoon, different groups were tasked with different jobs of the Chi'yakmesh peoples (from preparing kindling and weaving blankets to fishing in the Cheakamus river).

The elders and facilitators of Cheakamus also shared important knowledge about how elders (knowledge holding adults) should be treated with honour and respect, at the Longhouse, in the Hamilton community, and at home. Their values mirror the qualities of being HELPFUL, KIND, and SAFE that we treasure at Hamilton elementary."

Thank you to our parent volunteers, our Education Assistants, Ms. Thomas and Ms. M. Kaur, and especially to Ms. Wong and Mr. Chu for organizing this special event.
